Over the last couple of years we have been integrating morning prayer into morning Mass. Therefore when ...performed...by the faithful praying together with the priest...then it is truly the voice of the bride addressed to the bridegroom; it is the very prayer which Christ himself together with his body [the Church] addresses to the Father."
